Mike Jordan City Council:
Quick debrief of the ERETO meeting in June. The Outdoor Dining ad hoc working group formalized into the State Street Promenade and Interim Operations Committee to continuous discussions on parklet design and safety. Additionally, the group discussed the available

o was nue ility of public bathrooms, available resources, and associated safety concerns. Robin suggested creating a public restrooms map that could be pushed out.

Brian Bosse Public Works:

Continued discussion on previous bathroom projects, including what worked and what didn't, as well as previous ordinances or incentives for public bathroom usage through the City. The group acknowledged that there is a lot of work to be done following the 6/27 meeting on the ERETO ordinance, and a formal committee will review next steps and roll out accordingly. Other updates included the success of game night, with the next one scheduled for Wednesday 7/26, and the operation of a shuttle service on Fridays-Mondays from 11am-5pm, which had a successful pilot



weekend and will be formally marketed. The shuttle has 4 stops and offers hop-on, hop-off service, with tickets available for purchase at Visitor Centers or on board.

Community Updates:

Robin Elander Downtown Santa Barbara:

The Retail Working Group has initiated monthly meetings with downtown retailers to create a sense of community, explore marketing collaborations. There was a discussion on potential cross collaborations between Retail and F&B, as well as an overview of a possible Fashion Show event and marketing program for this upcoming Fall. Other updates include the Summer Music Series, Map and Guide, August Block Party, Downtown Summit in October, and the Downtown Business Spotlight partnership with Independent, which is broadcasted on TVSB and printed in the Independent.

New Business:

Aron Ashland proposed an idea to create a picture-worthy attraction in the middle of State Street facing towards the pier. The idea was to have a ribbon cutting ceremony and invite local celebrities and others to create a buzz. The group discussed taking inspiration from Paseo Nuevo and its strategies for retail success, including "moments of joy" such as large-scale board games like chess, connect 4, and Jenga, as well as pop-up markets, which can create buzz even with store vacancies and tap into the pop-up network without much effort. The group also talked about the concept of user-generated content and focusing on creating opportunities for other people to market for the organization.

Laura Knight chimed in with timing suggestions on Marketing Content, and Mike Jordan shared his experience with successful large scale events in Mammoth CA that drive consistent tourism and local participation. Ideas were shared as to how to mimic these successful endeavors in Santa Barbara.
